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A video installation composed of 13 screens, this work is a tribute to the flourishing tradition of the manifesto in twentieth century art.

All manifestos made use of incisive text – much in the manner of poetry – in the form of assertive, categorical proclamations aimed at destroying the past in favour of a new vision of art that was a more faithful reflection of the encroaching new world.

The German artist Julian Rosefeldt (born in Munich in 1965 and now resident in Berlin) conceived *Manifesto* in 2015 as a work comprising thirteen short films, each with a different setting. All the films save the prologue feature Oscar-winning Australian actress Cate Blanchett in a succession of virtuoso performances.

Blanchett's acting is at times in keeping and at times in contradictory contrast to the context and actions of her role. Each of the twelve scripts she interprets covers a particular artistic movement and is made up of a collage of manifestos. All but one of her roles are female, a decision Rosefeldt explains he made intentionally, to contrast the masculine character of manifestos which were written largely by men.

As well as working as director of the project, which entailed writing and over- seeing the shooting of the films (as

in his previous works, there is a noticeable predilection for high angle shots), Rosefeldt has drawn on extracts from manifestos dating from the entire span of the twentieth century – over fifty in total. The texts refer to various visual arts, dance, architecture, literature and film currents. The first words to resonate in the prologue, on the other hand, are from the *Manifesto of the Communist Party* written in 1848 by Karl Marx and Friedrich Engels, a choice that clearly underlines the revolutionary origins that all the artistic statements of this kind would follow.

There is a shifting relation between the plot of the film and the collage of manifestos. Visitors are encouraged to explore it each time and, in its entirety, the work generates more questions than answers – in line with the spirit of each of the manifestos in question, which stand as sweeping categorical statements.

By and large the manifestos were written by the "young and strong", advocating a "messy vitality" and "crude energy" against the system(s), ready to leave the past "behind them as carrion" and "to abolish the future" in favour of plunging into "the heart of the present". How do these proclamations sound to us today? How relevant are their arguments, stretched beyond the "uttermost boundaries of logic" to a homeless person, a housewife, a factory worker, a punk singer or a teacher?

Despite these questions, Julian Rosefeldt's work does not hint at any ambiguity. It is instead pervaded by a sense of clarity that comes from the accuracy of the historical research and the originality of the direction.

Sensitive to social and political issues, the artist has termed *Manifesto* a "call of action", an act of trust in the chance that the world can be changed, its rules turned upside down, just with the strength of a shared statement.

Ten years after its first public presentation in 2015, *Manifesto* has literally traveled the world in its dual form as a video installation and film, appearing in museums, art spaces, cinemas, festivals, retrospectives, and special projects, weaving together a rich and intriguing exhibition history between art and cinema.

Julian Rosefeldt / Bio

The Berlin-based artist Julian Rosefeldt (born in Munich in 1965) studied Architecture in Munich and Barcelona (MA 1994). He is internationally renowned for his visually opulent and meticulously choreographed moving image artworks, mostly presented as complex multi-screen installations. Inspired equally by the histories of film, art and popular culture, Rosefeldt uses familiar cinematic tropes to carry viewers into surreal, theatrical realms, where the inhabitants are absorbed by the rituals of everyday life, employing humour and satire to seduce audiences into familiar worlds made strange. Rosefeldt holds a professorship of Media Art at the Academy of Fine Arts in Munich since 2011.


